In this book, these leading scholars present 11 possible models of student affairs practice, based on a qualitative, multi-institutional case study research project involving 20 institutions of higher education varying by type, size and mission.

The American Faculty: The Restructuring of Academic Work and Careers

Co-authored by Jack H. Schuster and Martin J. Finkelstein, published by The Johns Hopkins University Press, 2008

Higher education is becoming destabilized in the face of extraordinarily rapid change. The composition of the academy's faculty and the essential nature of faculty work are being transformed. Schuster and Finkelstein describe the transformation of the American faculty in an extensive analysis of the American academic profession.
